



J. Tucci Construction Renovates 2300 Square Foot Louis Vuitton Store At Saks Fifth Avenue



J. Tucci Construction Corporation Corp. recently completed renovations on the the 2300 square foot Louis Vuitton Store on the first floor at Saks Fifth Avenue, New York, NY, which they previously constructed in 2003. The store faces the 50th street entrance of the landmarked Saks Fifth Avenue building, and re-opened November 8, 2010.

J. Tucci was retained to renovate the space largely because the store's ceilings were very low due to an old elevator system with a complex steel infrastructure. Their team set up a temporary store for Louis Vuitton to operate in, and then proceeded to remove the old elevator system while adding in a new dumbwaiter for employees to access the store's Asset Protection Area.

J. Tucci installed custom-built curved light fixtures from Lite Lab Corp. for the new store, as well as high-end custom millwork and solid teak wood flooring. The challenges of this project included tight deadlines, difficult delivery regulations and very specialized building materials that have long lead times. However, J. Tucci's expertise in the luxury retail sector and their highly skilled construction management protocols has been pivotal in circumventing these challenges.

According to the architect Larry Martin, "The complexity of the design requires Gertler & Wentz Architects, LLP to work hand in hand with J. Tucci Construction and the millworker. Going beyond the typical coordination for a construction project, we are able to achieve extremely tight tolerances and precision fitting with a diversity of materials and construction elements."



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
